NBCCD's Student Summer Residency Program June 8– August 12 2023

The NBCCD Student Summer Residency Program is for returning and graduating students, to spend up to 9 weeks focusing on exploration and advancement of technical skills.

INFORMATION ABOUT THE PROGRAM

- All placements will take place within the student's respective studio at the NBCCD Campus.
- Participants will be able to access the campus Monday Friday between the hours of 8 am – 5 pm, and weekends 8 am – 10 pm.
- Participants are required to set up and maintain a professional and safe workspace; any misuse of equipment/space will result in an immediate loss of access to the studio.
- All participants will have to pay a \$100 refundable damage deposit that will be collected at the beginning of the residency and returned once the residency has completed, and after an inspection of the space is conducted.
- Participants are responsible for all consumables/materials used throughout the residency.
- For most studios there will be an additional consumables fee for gas, clay, etc.
- Summer rental fees associated with the studios will be waived for participating in the residency and there is no stipend paid to the student for participating.
- Upon acceptance, participants will be required to attend a mandatory meeting to go over rules and expectations. There will be biweekly check-ins throughout the summer with the Student Life Coordinator to share updates and progress.
- Failure to abide by these guidelines may result in termination of the student's residency.

Applications are due Sunday, March 26.

The jury will review the applications and determine the successful applicants. A decision will be communicated by early April via email.

- Cover Letter should include the following information (Up to 500 words)
 - Personal information: address, telephone, email, website/social media
 - Brief biography
 - Describe the project or explorations you plan to work on
 - Outline how this experience will benefit your practice
 - Create a list of equipment and material you will be using to reach this goal (all equipment subject to approval by your Studio Head)
- 4 photos of recent work including a list with the following information:
 - o Name

- Title of work
- Techniques used

- $\circ \quad \text{Name of image} \\$
- Applicants must be in Good Academic Standing
