

FVA is the integral first year for students at NBCCD before applying to their chosen diploma program, launching their visual arts career, or continuing studies elsewhere. Learn how to mix and alter custom clays and glazes, make plaster moulds, and use gas and electric kilns.

Learn and explore ceramic techniques in the first year of the program and refine your own style in second year with guidance from your instructors.

FASHION DESIGN

Learn fashion illustration, sewing, pattern development, garment construction, and fitting with live models.

Finish first year with corset construction and, by second year, be ready for advanced studies in specialized finishing techniques, tailoring, and draping.

Gain in-depth knowledge of graphic design theory, professional technique, industry standards, and build your creative mind.

Explore all aspects of visual communication, including layout design, packaging design, logo design, posters, user interface (UI) design, information design, and digital illustrations.

Specialize in the illustration or design stream; illustration has a heavier focus on illustrative techniques, while design has a heavier focus on branding and layout design.

PHOTOGRAPHY/ VIDEOGRAPHY



Focus on digital photography/videography while learning the origins & vintage analogue techniques that made the art what it is today.

In your first year, study the history of photography, creative processes, artificial and natural lighting techniques, photo enhancement/manipulation, as well as camera technology and methods.

In second year, continue to learn about the media business, videography & sound, digital imaging and output, portfolio development, and how to advance in an evolving industry.

In-class guest lectures, off-site photoshoots, gallery exhibits, and our on-campus lighting studio will enhance your learning experience.

TEXTILE DESIGN

Learn how to work from fibre to fabric to finished pieces and choose to specialize in machine knitting or weaving.

In addition to machine knitting and weaving, study felting, spinning, screen printing, surface embellishment, and textile history in your two years of the program.

Explore different dye methods used to colour and design yarns and cloth, including fibre reactive dyes and natural dyes.

Our students make it all—housewares, accessories, garments, materials for artists, sculptures, and more!

The one-year Advanced Studio Practice certificate program offers graduating diploma students or those who want to develop their studio practice the opportunities, connections, and education to start their own entrepreneurial venture into the creative industry.

Develop and implement a professional career plan through networking, pop-up shows, exhibitions, wholesale opportunities, and more.

Focus on developing your studio practice in your medium of choice while working collaboratively with celebrated faculty advisors and professional mentors.

Learning Commons



Honeybee Folk School



Established in 2022, Honeybee Folk School is one of Atlantic Canada's first folk school initiatives focused on regenerative living. NBCCD is home to the Honeybee Folk School, where makers of all levels gather for creative workshops and courses. Half- and multi-day workshops and 7-week courses are offered in subjects such as knife-making, basketry, weaving on a loom, natural dyes, cheese-making, urban gardening, Wolastoquey language lessons, permaculture, and more.

Application process

Priority application deadlines:

Foundation Visual Arts — December 31 Diploma programs — January 15

Foundation Visual Arts (FVA) is where most students begin at NBCCD.

With competitive programs and limited seat availability, we encourage applicants to apply early to meet priority deadlines. Only applications with all supporting documents will be considered complete and be evaluated.

Requirements for a complete application

Consideration for program eligibility is based on:

- Complete online application form
- Paid application fee (\$50 domestic; \$100 international applicants)
- Official transcript and academic background
- Portfolio

Proof of English Language Proficiency and an interview may also be required.

Portfolio

Applicants are required to submit a portfolio.

Foundation Visual Arts portfolio requirements:

- A letter of intent
- A minimum of 10 images representing your creativity and interest in visual art—mediums may include fine art, craft, photography, digital media, and video.

Submit your online **APPLICATION** at nbccd.ca/apply by creating an account in our applicant portal and pay your **APPLICATION FEE**.

We accept applications until our programs are full, but for the best chance of obtaining one of our limited seats, apply by the priority deadline for your program.





Upload your **PORTFOLIO** on your applicant portal.





Ask your current/former school to send your official transcript via email to nbccd.admissions@gnb.ca.





Proof of **ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY** if your first language is not English, or you have not attended an English-medium school for at least 3 years.

Visit nbccd.ca/admissions for acceptable tests and score requirements.


