- An Accessible Workstation

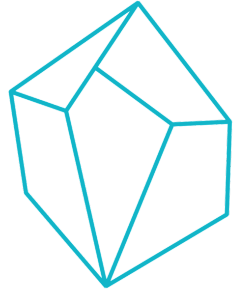
Returning Items

If we cannot find what you are looking for in a public library we can place an **inter-library loan (ILL)** request and ask another library in Canada to lend us the item you are looking for.

Accessibility

We strive to create an inclusive environment at the library. This includes offering barrier-free access to our services and collections. Examples of our accessible services and collections are:

- Alternative formats such as audiobooks
- An accessible workstation with software like Dragon Naturally Speaking and Kurzweil 3000
- Access to material in alternative formats from CELA (Centre for Equitable Library Access)

For those diagnosed as having a print disability, the library provides access to services such as the **Talking Book Service** and **Bookshare** through CELA. For more information on accessible services speak with Library staff.

Course Reserves

Most items in our collection can be borrowed for 3 weeks. However, sometimes we set books aside for a particular class or assignment.
