

BAUHAUS

The Foundation Visual Arts (FVA) program at NBCCD is inspired by the groundbreaking principles of Walter Gropius's Bauhaus School, which profoundly impacted 20th-century art education by merging fine art and design. Gropius, the visionary behind the Bauhaus, valued technical skill and material mastery, but emphasized that curiosity and experimentation are the true cornerstones of artistic growth. He envisioned the foundational year as a journey of liberating the individual from traditional thought processes, enabling personal discoveries and experiences that reveal one's full potential, while recognizing inherent limitations.



DIPLOMA | 2 YEARS | 6 SEMESTERS

Rooted in 3D design principles and visual communication, students engage in creative problem-solving through digital technology. Emphasizing modeling, texturing, drawing, animation, and world building, this program positions students at the forefront of creative industries, including game design, visual film effects, 3D printing, virtual reality, simulation, and animation.

Through extensive exploration, ceramics students delve into a diverse array of techniques, including wheel-thrown, hand-built, slipcast, molded, and digitally rendered methods. FASHION DESIGN

DIPLOMA | 2 YEARS | 6 SEMESTERS

Starting with the fundamentals of sewing, pattern development, and garment construction, and building upon these acquired skills, students engage in advanced studies in corset construction, draping, tailoring, and made-to-measure fashion. The human body serves as the canvas, where technical proficiency merges with a personal sense of design to create wearable art that transitions seamlessly from the studio to the runway, and into everyday life.

DIPLOMA | 2 YEARS | 6 SEMESTERS

Acquire comprehensive expertise in graphic design theory, professional techniques, and industry standards while nurturing your creative vision. Choose to specialize in either illustration (digital drawing and image creation) or design (branding and layout) to develop your professional portfolio.

DIPLOMA | 2 YEARS | 4 SEMESTERS

Traditional methods, contemporary design, and digital innovations converge in the jewellery and metal arts program. Students learn to transform raw materials such as gold, silver, and copper into wearable art and sculptural objects. By mastering both modern and historic techniques, they create unique works of art, custom jewellery, and heirlooms of our time.




TEXTILE DESIGN

DIPLOMA | 2 YEARS | 4 SEMESTERS

Dedicated to building community and fostering the Canadian sustainable textiles economy, students major in one of two textiles streams: weaving or machine knitting. They work from fiber to fabric to finished pieces, learning to spin yarn, felt, screen-print, embellish, and dye. Through these processes, students create soft sculptures and functional art, promoting sustainable practices and human-scale livelihoods.

Located in Waponahkik (Wabanaki Homeland) this program is unique to Turtle Island (North America) through its concentration on the traditional craft mediums of the Waponahkiyik - Wolastoqiyik, Mi'kmaq, Peskotomuhkatiyik, Panuwapskewiyik, and Aponahkewiyik (Wabanaki Peoples). Students have the opportunity to explore Waponahki artistry, history, and culture under the guidance of Waponahki artists. From there, students select their own preferred materials, which may encompass basket-making, woodcarving, beading, wampum, guillwork, and beyond.



















CREATIVE CAREERS

Advanced Studio Practice

CERTIFICATE | 1 YEAR | 2 SEMESTERS

Students with an NBCCD diploma or equivalent experience in fine craft, design, or visual arts may apply for NBCCD's two-semester certificate in Advanced Studio Practice (ASP). Students focus on self-directed studio work, in addition to implementing a professional career plan through networking, exhibitions, wholesale opportunities, and more. The key focus is studio practice in a student's area of concentration, supported by collaboration with celebrated faculty advisors and professional mentors. This program is suitable for graduates, designers, artists, and individuals with a fine craft practice who wish to engage in a supportive, collegial environment while evolving their distinct career goals. Students acquire business skills and enhanced studio practice to launch into self-employment or a successful career in the creative cultural sector.



Craft Sale

Building on the college's dedication to designing a sustainable future, Honeybee Folk School was established at NBCCD to offer non-credit, public education to the broader community. As one of the first folk school initiatives in Atlantic Canada, Honeybee provides workshops focused on regenerative living, traditional skills, and fine craft. Makers of all levels come together for non-credit workshops and courses each season. Subjects include knife-making, ceramics, basketry, loom weaving, natural dye methods, wood-fired pizza making, urban gardening, permaculture, and more. NBCCD students receive discounted access to all folk school courses and are encouraged to apply as workshop instructors upon graduation.
