Foundation Visual Arts (FVA) at NBCCD draws inspiration from the Bauhaus School, founded by Walter Gropius, which revolutionized 20th-century art education by uniting fine art, design, and craftsmanship.

Emphasizing experimentation, material exploration, and liberation from traditional thinking, the Bauhaus approach shapes our first year as a catalyst for personal discovery, creative growth, and diploma success.



NBCCD's George Fry Gallery is named in honour of a former college director and principal (1976-1993). George Fry introduced "design" into the college's name, moved the college to its current location along the Wolastoq (Saint John River), and introduced programs and courses in drawing, design, photography, surface design, and Indigenous arts to help preserve traditional Wabanaki craft techniques.

The gallery provides students with professional exhibition opportunities; an understanding of curation, marketing, and installation; and is open to the public for questions and campus tours.



Fredericton is more than just the capital city of New Brunswick; it's a dynamic hub of culture, creativity, and community. Here, storied streets lined with charming boutiques, art galleries, and cozy cafés invite exploration and discovery.

As a student in downtown Fredericton, you're at the heart of the craft network and Historic Garrison District. Full-time students receive a city bus pass, free admission into the Beaverbrook Art Gallery, and student discounts across the city.
